
Word endings: -us and -ous

Lots of words use these endings so it's important to learn the rule. If a word is a noun (a naming word), then use -us. If the word is an adjective (describes something), use -ous. Circle the correct spelling for each word.



-ch or -tch?

It's likely that you'll hear lots of words with a *ch* sound but you won't always be able to hear the t sound as sometimes it's silent. Tick the words below that are spelt correctly.

whitch	catch	witch
coach	toutch	bench
wach	approatch	fetch

Tip time!

If the letter(s) before the ch sound is either one consonant or two vowels. use ch.

If there is only one vowel before the ch sound then use tch. Remember to watch out for irregular words!




